

along with Road Signs (those who place informative Save the Date signs) will begin at the March Club meeting. Signs will be posted in late May due to city guidelines.



What's Happening with the Serenity Garden?


JOIN AND WATCH US GROW!

After two long years of investigation and planning for the McMinnville Garden Club project called The Serenity Garden, the project has become a reality of notice by hospital employees and staff along with the community. We are thrilled to partner with the Willamette Valley Medical Center (WVMC) in this project. The land has been generously loaned to the Club to develop and act as stewards of the land. WVMC's role will be to provide ongoing maintenance in the form of watering, providing electricity, and general upkeep.

The Garden is projected to be completed in five distinct Phases and is located on the back side of the hospital away from Highway 18 noise and congestion.

Phase One introduced and accomplished the hanging of three beautiful baskets outside the windows of the Cancer Center at WVMC in both the spring and fall of 2021. These baskets can be viewed by patients while receiving treatments and add a touch of color with calming greenness. It is hoped that baskets remain an ongoing part of the project given adequate funding.

Phase Two was recently completed in January, 2022. New trees, both deciduous and fir, were positioned on the edge of a berm which hides and insulates the comings and goings of large semi-trucks without blocking the view from the interior of the hospital.



Phase Three started in February of 2022. Discussions regarding the addition and location of a walking path within the Garden are being held. This path is planned to connect to an existing path around the south parking lot. The existing path is used by both patients, visitors, and the general public, and adequately accessible by wheelchairs and walkers. To assist in the funding of this project phase, several steps are being taken including, but not limited to, solicitation of funds from the community, submission of a grant request, and educational, informational posts on social media, and an in house hospital campaign to introduce hospital workers to its benefits; particularly, during the Covid pandemic.



Recipes from Betty

Betty Ballentine

Betty's Irish Soda Bread

Makes one small loaf and it's great toasted if you have any leftovers!



2 ½ C flour

2 T sugar

1 t baking soda

1 t baking powder

½ t salt

Whisk together in a mixing bowl. Then cut in 3 T cold butter till you have fine crumbs.

Add in: ½ C currants or raisins

¾ C buttermilk

Mix to form a soft dough. Turn onto lightly floured board and knead for 2 minutes until smooth. Shape dough into a 6-inch flattened round on a greased pan. Cut an X on top the loaf. Brush

with a little buttermilk and sprinkle with coarse sugar. This gives the bread a nice crunch. Bake at 375 degrees for 35 minutes. Cool on wire rack.


